ABANDONED DEVOTION IN THE CHURCH:

- The body of Christ in Myanmar filled up daily with the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 5:18), emptying themselves of all that hinders this daily filling process.
- Believers living in victory over sin and the self-life (Romans 8:5-11), embracing the cross (Galatians 2:20) and denying themselves (Matthew 16:24).
- Believers rooted in the depths of the Word of God. Meditating on it, studying it, reflecting, praying the Word for long hours and obeying it (Psalm 1:2-3; Joshua 1:8; Psalm 119:9-16).

GROWING MISSION MOBILIZATION IN THE CHURCH:

- Believers and local churches growing in understanding of the big picture will (Colossians 1:9) and purpose of God in this age being the “fulfillment of the Great Commission.” (Matthew 24:14; Genesis 12:3)
- Believers and local churches aligning with the Biblical, Spirit-led approach of rapid-reproducing Church Planting Movements (also known as Disciple-Making Movements) among unreached people groups in Myanmar.
- Believers overcoming the traditional, financial barriers (Acts 18:1-4) to being “sent” by taking jobs, careers and families, relocating to live among unreached peoples, deriving an income in that place while proclaiming the Gospel of the Kingdom.
