Though the 8th poorest country in the world, the Church is strong in this small sub-sahara African nation, with over 70% of the total population being Christians and 40% of these being evangelical and charismatic followers of Jesus. Malawi's missionary sending movement is growing as the churches grasp the Great Commission as being their responsibility. In the 1900's the Gospel came to Malawi in power and now the Malawian Church is ready to be mobilized and equipped to educate, inspire and activate their own local churches and entire denominations/ church networks. A primary obstacle of this burgeoning mobilization movement to the unreached is finance. Yet, we know the Great Commission is not only for affluent national Churches. So God evidently has an alternative plan to the traditional mission sending finance model the global Church has become accustomed to. Let's pray for the Malawian Church to arise with God's Biblical vision of engaging in the Great Commission among the unreached through using skills, abilities, professions to derive an income while proclaiming the Gospel and making disciples.



Let's pray... ABANDONED DEVOTION IN THE CHURCH:

- Believers and local churches embracing (and glorying) in their human weakness, not their strength. The way of the world is showing forth strength while the way of the Kingdom is embracing weakness, trusting and depending on God in humility to work in and through us (Proverbs 3:5-6).
- Believers and local churches growing in dying to self and walking alive to God, buying into the truth at the heart level that "I am no longer my own, but have been bought with a price." (1 Cor. 6:12)
- The Holy Spirit enabling believers and local churches to grow in loving Jesus with all the heart, mind, soul and strength. (Matthew 22:37)

GROWING MISSION MOBILIZATION IN THE CHURCH:

- Believers and local churches maturing in Christ so as not to see merely the obstacles in front of the advancing Church but to see the possibilities through the eyes of faith, saying with Caleb of old, "We should go up and take possession of the land, for we can certainly do it!" (Numbers 13:30)
- Believers and local churches overcoming three common hindrances in mission understanding - fear, having a small vision of God and lack of willingness to fight and persevere.
- For effective anointed missionary mobilizers springing up by the hundreds to empower local ministries to rightly understand and be activated in the Great Commission, with a burning vision that God is giving to the unreached and uncommitted people groups of Africa Western as heritage.
