ABANDONED DEVOTION IN THE CHURCH:

- Believers and local churches growing in spiritual strength and might to “Apply and Do” the Word of God, not simply hearing only and deceiving ourselves that we are rightly following Christ. (James 1:22) Steadfast, costly, radical and wholehearted devotion to Jesus as a living Person, not to a religion, concept or idea.
- Believers and local churches submitting themselves more to God, resisting the three primary areas of temptation – the lust of the eyes, lust of the flesh and the pride of life (1 John 2:15)
- Believers and local churches coming into full agreement with Jesus’ heart, “...not my will but Yours be done” (Luke 22:42), living for His glory on the earth alone.

GROWING MISSION MOBILIZATION IN THE CHURCH:

- Every local ministry leader embracing their primary calling as “for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry” (Ephesians 3:12) including equipping for cross-cultural ministry both near and far.
- Believers and local churches overcoming the common fear of facing challenges and difficulties. True faith embraces challenges believing God is greater than the circumstance being faced.
- Every local ministry deliberately training members for cross-cultural ministry by engaging with various minority, immigrant groups (particularly unreached if possible) in the home city.
